Associate in Arts and Sciences

The Associate in Arts and Sciences degree in Liberal Arts is designed for persons who plan to transfer to a four-year college or university to complete a baccalaureate



program. The curriculum consists of courses in the humanities, including a foreign language, natural sciences, and social sciences usually required in the first two years of a baccalaureate Liberal Arts curriculum.

To prepare for junior class standing at a four-year institution, students usually must complete a program at the community college which is comparable in length and content to the first years of the program at a four-year college or university. Subsequently, students are urged to acquaint themselves with the requirements of the major department in the institution in which transfer is contemplated and also to consult with the Counseling Center in planning this program and selecting electives. Students should also check the mathematics requirements of the four-year college or university to which they plan to transfer to determine the proper mathematics courses to be taken in the community college.

In addition to the admission requirements established for the College, entry into the Liberal Arts program requires the satisfactory completion of high school units or the equivalent to include four years of English, three years of mathematics (Algebra I, Algebra II, and Geometry), one year of laboratory science, and one year of history. At least two years of a foreign language are recommended.
